




Kindness in Action


Connecting Minds












Poster Making-One Plastic Bag


Infographic Web Chart






Four Great Winds



Fruit Art Adventure




Suggi









Otthakshara

Nature's Creatures








Uses of Trees


Salim Ali
















Save our Environment








Amma and Jaanapada




Poster making of Ramayana Characters




Animal Mask








Role Play - 'The Thirsty Crow'






Vegetable Print








Samay Bahut He Mulya Hai





Activity Log

By doing this activity, students reinforced the names of shapes, spatial relationship and fine motor skills. This activity develops cognitive development and creative thinking.












Fun With Bills




Measures of Mass-Weighing Scale

Decimals



Volumes






SCIENCE








The True Method Of Knowledge Is Experiment






Let's Get Stronger- Joints And Muscles


Cave Painting


